Christmas Eve Services

Provisions are being worked out for live streaming to other parts of our building during the children's worship service at 5:00 p.m. with seating in the Gathering Room and in the Church Sanctuary.

We are also offering a Candlelight service at 6:30 p.m. where we will be using the existing protocols for worship in the Sanctuary

Washington County Precautions for Worship in a Sanctuary

- Gov. Evers Emergency Order #1 states in part: individual, age five and older, in Wisconsin shall wear a face covering if the individual is indoors.
- Washington Ozaukee Public Health Department revised the capacity recommendations for churches to be set at 25% capacity.
- Members that are feeling ill should stay home.
- Anyone uncomfortable about attending worship in person, should watch the service on our website on the internet
- If you are not wearing a mask, we assume you fall into one of the exemption categories.
- We have a stationary collection box at the entrance for offering
- Operate under physical distancing protocols of 6 feet when possible.
- Do not shake hands.
- Discontinue use of common cup when celebrating communion
- Do not reuse programs between services. Dispose of them!
- We encourage members to speak with each other, but please speak outside in the fresh air rather than staying in the building.
- Disinfect items after each service including faucets, doorknobs, pews, railings, and elevator buttons.
