Opening Hymn: ELH 210 "Lord, Take My Hand and Lead Me"

The Invocation

P: We worship in the name of our Triune God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

The Confession and Absolution

P: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us;C: But if we confess our sin, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sin and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

P: Let us confess our sins to God our Father.

C: Merciful Father, we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We justly deserve Your present and eternal punishment. For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your ways to the glory of Your holy name.

P: Dear brothers and sisters in Christ: be assured that what Jesus came to do has been accomplished! He paid for your sins, each and every one of them, by His suffering and death on the cross. Your sins are forgiven! Furthermore, Christ's resurrection from the grave proves that His payment for us was perfect and complete, a sacrifice wholly acceptable to the Father. Because of what Christ Jesus has done, know that peace with God has been restored to you as a gift, and that you will live forever in Paradise. Whoever believes this truth and is baptized shall be saved. Amen.

Prayer for the Day

P: O Lord, you are always more ready to hear than we are to pray, and to give more than we either desire or deserve. Pour on us the abundance of your mercy, forgiving us for the things which make our conscience afraid and giving us the good things we are unworthy to ask except through the work of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

The Old Testament Lesson: 1 Kings 19: 9-18

(How few accept God's covenant of grace! After the victorious face-off between the Lord and Baal on Mount Carmel, the prophet was dejected by the thought that he alone followed God. But souls are not converted through mighty acts of judgment (wind, earthquake, or fire). Hearts are converted through the gentle gospel whisper of a prophet. In fact, the "communion of saints" in Israel numbered seven thousand. What a consolation for lonely confessors like Elijah!)

⁹He came to a cave and spent the night there. Then the word of the Lord suddenly came to him saying, "Why are you here, Elijah?"

¹⁰He said, "I have been very zealous for the Lord, the God of Armies, but the people of Israel have abandoned your covenant. They have torn down your altars and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking to take my life."

¹¹Then the Lord said, "Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the Lord, for the Lord is passing by." Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountains and shattered rocks before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind came an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake. ¹²After the earthquake there was a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire. After the fire there was a soft, whispering voice.

¹³When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his cloak, and he went out and stood at the entrance to the cave. Then a voice came to him and said, "Why are you here, Elijah?"

¹⁴He said, "I have been very zealous for the Lord, the God of Armies, but the people of Israel have abandoned your covenant. They have torn down your altars and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking to take my life."

¹⁵Then the Lord said to him, "Go back the way you came and go to the Wilderness of Damascus. When you get there, you are to anoint Hazael as king over Aram. ¹⁶You will also anoint Jehu son of Nimshi as king over Israel and Elisha son of Shaphat from Abel Meholah as prophet in your place. ¹⁷Whoever escapes the sword of Hazael, Jehu will kill, and whoever escapes the sword of Jehu, Elisha will kill. ¹⁸But I have preserved in Israel seven thousand whose knees have not bent to Baal and whose lips have not kissed him." *The Holy Bible, Evangelical Heritage Version® (EHV®) copyright* © 2017

Epistle Lesson: Romans 9:1-5

(St. Paul has a pastor's heart for his own people. Many blood descendants of Abraham rejected their Savior, Jesus Christ. The apostle wishes he could take their place under God's judgment.)

I am speaking the truth in Christ—I am not lying—my conscience testifies with me in the Holy Spirit ²that I have great sorrow and continuous pain in my heart. ³For I almost wish that I myself could be cursed and separated from Christ in place of my brothers, my relatives according to the flesh, ⁴those who are Israelites. Theirs are the adoption as sons, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises. ⁵Theirs are the patriarchs, and from them, according to the flesh, came the Christ, who is God over all, eternally blessed. Amen. (EHV)

Gospel Lesson: Matthew 14:22-33

(The disciples were terrified at the sight of Jesus walking on the water. Their fears were dispelled when He said, "It is I. Don't be afraid." The life of a Christian is often riddled with fears, doubts, and distractions. But even a "little faith" finds strength in the gracious promises of the almighty Son of God. When storms of life pass, we too will worship Jesus with a deeper confidence.)

²²Immediately Jesus urged the disciples to get into the boat and to go ahead of him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowd. ²³After he had dismissed the crowd, he went up onto the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone. ²⁴By then the boat was quite a distance from shore, being pounded by the waves because the wind was against it. ²⁵In the fourth watch of the night, Jesus came toward them, walking on the sea. ²⁶When the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified and cried out in fear, "It's a ghost!" ²⁷But Jesus spoke to them at once, saying, "Take heart! It is I! Do not be afraid." ²⁸Peter answered him and said, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water."

²⁹Jesus said, "Come!" Peter stepped down from the boat, walked on the water, and went toward Jesus. ³⁰But when he saw the strong wind, he was afraid. As he began to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!"

³¹Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand, took hold of him, and said to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" ³²When they got into the boat, the wind stopped. ³³Those who were in the boat worshipped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God!" (EHV)
