# Second Lesson: Romans 11:33-36

(St. Paul finishes a section that demonstrates how God's wisdom can turn mankind's disobedience into an opportunity for mercy. No wonder the apostle breaks forth into a hymn of praise! Who could have thought of such a thing? It could only be the unsearchable wisdom of our triune God!)

<sup>33</sup>Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how untraceable his ways! <sup>34</sup>"For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who has been his adviser?" <sup>35</sup>"Or who has first given to God that he will be repaid?" <sup>36</sup>For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be the glory forever! Amen. (*EHV*)

#### Gospel Lesson: Matthew 16: 13-20

(Human reason cannot consider Jesus to be any more than a prophet—the forerunner of the Messiah at best. But Peter, on behalf of the other disciples, confesses, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." On this bedrock confession the entire church of God is built. We who are built upon Christ have overcome the dark powers of death. Jesus gave all Christians the authority to proclaim freedom to penitent sinners. Likewise, Christ's voice is heard through us when we withhold forgiveness from those who proudly insist on their life of sin.)

<sup>13</sup>When Jesus came into the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" <sup>14</sup>They said, "Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others — Jeremiah or one of the prophets." <sup>15</sup>He said to them, "But you, who do you say that I am?" <sup>16</sup>Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

<sup>17</sup>Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for flesh and blood did not reveal this to you, but my Father who is in heaven. <sup>18</sup>And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell will not overpower it. <sup>19</sup>I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." <sup>20</sup>Then he commanded the disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Christ. # The Confession of Faith — The Nicene Creed

C: I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried. And the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. And he will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, whose kingdom will have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets. And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church, I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen
