P: Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires are known, and no secrets are hidden. Cleanse our thoughts by Your Holy Spirit, that we may love you and honor your holy name.

Let us confess our sins:

C: Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Maker of all things, Judge of the world:

We confess that we have sinned against your divine majesty by thought, word, and deed. We have provoked your anger against us. We repent and are truly sorry for our sins. It grieves us to think about them. Their burden is heavy. Have mercy on us, gracious Father. Forgive us our sins for the sake of your Son Jesus Christ. Grant that we may serve you with a new life, to the honor of your holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

P: Rejoice! The Lord God, according to His promise, is slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. By the command of Christ and the authority of my holy office, I forgive your sins, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

C: (Spoken) Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost; as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, forevermore. Amen.

P: God of all power and might, you are the giver of all that is good. The First Lesson: Genesis: 2:15-24

(God instituted marriage to be for one man and one woman. They were to make their marriage the primary relationship in their lives.)

15 The Lord God took the man and settled him in the Garden of Eden to work it and to take care of it. 16 The Lord God gave a command to the man. He said, "You may freely eat from every tree in the garden, 17 but you shall not eat from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, for on the day that you eat from it, you will certainly die."

18 The Lord God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper who is a suitable partner for him." 19 Out of the soil the Lord God had formed every wild animal and every bird of the sky, and he brought them to the man to see what he would call them. Whatever the man called every living creature that became its name. 20 The man gave names to all the livestock, and to the birds of the sky, and to every wild animal, but for Adam no helper was found who was a suitable partner for him. 21 The Lord God caused the man to fall into a deep sleep. As the man slept, the Lord God took a rib and closed up the flesh where it had been. 22 The Lord God built a woman from the rib that he had taken from the man and brought her to the man.

23 The man said, "Now this one is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh. She will be called 'woman,' because she was taken out of man. 24 For this reason a man will leave his father and his mother and will remain united with his wife, and they will become one flesh."

Psalm of the Day: Psalm 128 (selected verses)

P: How blessed is everyone who fears the Lord,

C: Everyone who is walking in his ways.

The Second Lesson: Ephesians 5:22-32

(Husband and wife each have a role in marriage by God's design as they serve each other.)

22 Wives, submit to your own husbands as to the Lord. 23 For the husband is the head of the wife, just as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he himself is the Savior. 24 Moreover, as the church submits to Christ, so also wives are to submit to their husbands in everything.

25 Husbands, love your wives, in the same way as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her 26 to make her holy, by cleansing her with the washing of water in connection with the Word. 27 He did this so that he could present her to himself as a glorious church, having no stain or wrinkle or any such thing, but so that she would be holy and blameless. 28 In the same way, husbands have an obligation to love their own wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. 29 To be sure, no one has ever hated his own body, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, 30 because we are members of his body, of his flesh and of his bones.

31 "For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will be one flesh." 32 This is a great mystery, but I am talking about Christ and the church. 33 In any case, each one of you also is to love his wife as himself, and each wife is to respect her husband. (EHV)

The Gospel Lesson: Matthew 11: 25-30

(The mysteries of the kingdom of heaven have been hidden from those who, in their conceit, consider themselves wise and learned. However, the Father committed his plan of salvation to the Son. The Son, in turn, calls those who are weary and burdened by their sin. Jesus gives the rest their souls crave.)

25 At that time, Jesus continued, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that you have hidden these things from clever and learned people and have revealed them to little children. 26 Yes, Father, because this was pleasing to you. 27 Everything has been entrusted to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son wants to reveal him.

28 "Come to me all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. 29 Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, because I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. 30 For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." (EHV)
