Old Testament Lesson: Exodus 12: 1-14

(God gave his people instructions for the observance of the Passover. The Passover Lamb, which was without defect and granted deliverance from death, prefigures Christ the Lamb of God, who was also perfect, and whose blood delivers us from eternal death.)

¹ The Lord told Moses and Aaron this in the land of Egypt: ² This month is to be the beginning of your calendar. It is to be the first month of the year for you. ³ Tell the entire Israelite community that on the tenth day of this month, they are to take a lamb or a young goat for themselves, according to their fathers' households, one lamb per household. ⁴ But if the household is too small for a whole lamb, then that person and his neighbor next door to him must select one, based on the number of people. Determine what size lamb is needed according to how much each person will eat. ⁵ Your lamb must be unblemished, a year-old male. You may take it from the sheep or the goats. ⁶ You are to keep it until the fourteenth day of this month. Then the whole assembly of the Israelite community is to slaughter the lambs at sunset.

⁷They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses where they eat the lamb. ⁸ That night they shall eat the meat that has been roasted over a fire, along with unleavened bread. They shall eat it with bitter herbs. ⁹Do not eat it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over a fire—with its head, its legs, and its internal organs. ¹⁰ You shall not leave any of it until the morning. Whatever remains until the morning, you shall burn in the fire. ¹¹ This is how you are to eat it: with your cloak tucked into your belt ready for travel, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. Eat it in haste. It is the Lord's Passover.

The Epistle Lesson: 1 Corinthians 11:23-32

(We preach Christ crucified in the Lord's Supper.)

²³ For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night when he was betrayed, took bread, ²⁴ and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." ²⁵ In the same way, after the meal, he also took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new testament in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." ²⁶ For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the Lord's body and blood. ²⁸ Instead, let a person examine himself and after doing so, let him eat of the bread and drink from the cup. ²⁹ For if anyone eats and drinks in an unworthy way because he does not recognize the Lord's body, he eats and drinks judgment on himself. ³⁰ Because of this, many among you are weak and sick, and quite a few have fallen asleep. ³¹ But if we judged ourselves, we would not be undergoing judgment. ³² However, when we undergo judgment, we are being disciplined by the Lord so that we may not be condemned with the world. (EHV)

Gospel Lesson: John 13: 1-15, 34

(The Gospel of John does not highlight the institution of the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. But as Jesus washes his disciples' feet, he gently instructs them in its meaning, and issues his "new command" to love as he has loved.)

¹ Before the Passover Festival, Jesus knew that the time had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved those who were his own in the world, he loved them to the end. ² By the time the supper took place, the Devil had already put the idea
